One person expressed his dislike of the implied trade of taxes for more services.

Another liked ideas of community policing, officers present at meetings and gatherings, town meeting. More of a relationship between residents and police officers. What number to call for non-emergency? 413-625-8200 shelburne non-emergency.

Define community policing? Include speed enforcement in this, but not much other in addition to the comments above about attending community events.

Grants for community policing recommended.

Officer John Bonifini shared that ticket violation funds 50% comes to town if written on town road. Nothing comes to the Town as revenue if ticket written on a state road.

John B also offered explanation of how we will never have to pay for academy training. Claire pointed out that we have to plan for it as a possibility, and historically we average a new officer per year

Police department facility is "deplorable" (quote indicating opinion of a few) which should be addressed.
