
Do you feel the department has the right amount of management, meaning hours of work by a Chief or Lieutenant? Currently our Police Chief is funded for 19 hours per week.












a request for attention to solving off road vehicles was deemed "not enough staff"




Options for future policing

As implied by the name of the committee, our focus is evaluating different models of operating to accomplish the activities of a typical small town police department in a financially sustainable way. Due to anticipated state training requirements, the Town may be presented with increased expenses in the Police Department each time we need to hire. Please remember all budget increases require increases in tax bills when rating your preferences in the following chart. The Chief of Police position is currently part time (19 hrs per week), the Lieutenant is also part time (19 hrs per week), and the department has part time staff to fill in additional hours of patrolling and call response. In the current department, none of the positions come with paid time off or health insurance, benefits required for jobs of 20 hours per week and above. Based on new legislation, in the near future, all officers will either pass full-time training requirements to be eligible for police work in Massachusetts, or will not be allowed to serve, even part time. Please consider these options for the future of the department. These are ideas at this point.

Create a residency requirement for the Chief if we continue to have one

I'm an abolitionist. The other day there was a traffic accident of some sort on the entrance of my street and no less than four police cars showed up. Why did we need so many? Why do we need someone with a gun to direct traffic? To make a routine traffic stop? While the current status of policing in our town seems to not be an issue, it is clear that police are indoctrinated into a culture of racism and violence in all of their training, and that fully impairs their ability to keep all their citizens safe. I do not feel safe when I see a cop. If we must have police, we should merge with another town to hopefully decrease the presence of police everywhere.

Fund the academy training with the clause that they are employed by the town for a period of 3 to 5 years. Otherwise hire personnel that are already trained.

More patrol hours; seek grant monies for building renovation; look at other town departments' funding before assuming that we would have to raise taxes to increase funding for our police department, which makes our town a safer one.

My answer is to let the police develop as their needs evolve. They know more than I what needs addressing.

We must remember that New Salem is a sovereign town government, and that public safety is one of the basic functions of local government. The state Department Of Revenue would like to have fewer towns and consolidation of Public Safety "plays right into their hands". We must be careful not to give away our autonomy.

The town needs to keep the Police Department it currently has.

a full time chief and a full time lieutenant with at least one full time officer for community patrol. Route 202 is a major highway and a vehicle for nefarious activities that cannot be monitored appropriately with the current police staffing.

I would prefer it remain the same, would be open for a shared Chief but keep separation. New Salem is growing and we need to maintain a Police Department and remain flexible as the size and demographics of the town will probably change, requiring us to adapt to the change.

The town cruiser should not be used to commute back and forth from a town as far away as Belchertown. If the chief lived in Orange or Wendell, that would be different, but the commute from Belchertown is putting a lot of miles on the town equipment.

I think it has improved in the past couple of years. There are more patrols and interaction with the public. I think with all officers and chief being held accountable for accomplishing duties in which they are paid will show a productive and cost effective department.

Seems ok to me

As in the past, we need a part-time Chief and one part time Officer and one shared vehicle. The Chief should live in town. The exponential growth of the police Dept. is not warranted by population growth or crime in this town.

I am not familiar with total number of officers, hours they work, or benefits provided. \$29 may be a little low, unless receiving a benefits package which could help compensate some of the wages.

I'll leave that to law enforcement professionals.

Hire 2 more part time officers

I strongly support a model working with another town like our fire department model so that we can hire and pay a full-time chief with benefits. It would be nice to then have local officers principally assigned to each town, overlapping when need be, keeping a police station in each town. I am very much against the current policy of having our chief drive a police cruiser home...essentially leaving a police cruiser in Belchertown most of the week where it can be used for non-New Salem overtime highway detail work. It would be nice to see mileage figures on the car for how many actual hours are from work patrolling in New salem and how many hours have been put on the car for the chief's personal use.

there is no reason to maintain the expense of an independent department, time to combine with another department

I would favor keeping chief hours the same and increasing other staff hours. Ideally, I'd like the police to be able to live in New Salem and to be members of our small community.

Full time patrolman

If it ain't broke, don't fix it just because of a hypothetical scenario that might not happen. Priority should be making the police station humane and safe. It is unconscionable that we make them work there. I can't believe we haven't been sued.

Wouldn't it still be less expensive to budget for special training than to hire full time Chief?

Reduce

You ask how to change things without giving specifics. For instance, how are hours for staff designated, how many officers and vehicles, etc are now in service. Very vague in my opinion. My taxes have increased substantially but I see no major improvements.

I would like to see a full time police chief who engages with the residents of New Salem and sees him/herself as a member of the community who can help neighbors live in harmony together while keep up New Salem as safe place to live. Community policing should be the goal.

Have a chief live in town not 18 miles away!!

Full-time chief or share with other town(s) so there is full-time access to a chief

Just like we regionale the schools I think we should do that with the police and anything else also.

Seems to me that knowing more about our police and their policing objectives would be good.

I don't think any changes to the current set-up are necessary, but I do think that the police need good office space that's comfortable and safe for their presence and work. If some part of the old Town Hall can be renovated to house them, that would be ideal. Otherwise, perhaps they could share some space with the Fire Dept, in the conference room end of the building. Can that big space have offices partitioned off?

Look into state funds or grant money to renovate the police station with functional improvements. Don't need flashy expensive cosmetic improvements.

Can the police station be combined with existing fire station, is there room?

Please note: we do not support defunding of our police department.

Support and expand, as traffic appear to increase through the community we need more patrol. We should not be cutting back, we should be looking to expand and provide better service with a new station, better pay and benefits.

Full time chief, more officers, improved equipment

Top priority personally is ensuring that the police are able to respond to emergency calls and arrive on scene in under 10 minutes (in the vast majority of urgent situations) regardless of chosen policing method in the end

Keep department as is, reducing staff to level fund over time

We should have a chief who lives somewhere near New Salem. When our current Chief moved to Belchertown, he should have been relieved of his duties.

Get someone that lives in Town!!

Use state police more...incorporate with another town.

Full time chief and a full time officer. Pay for training and run a professional department.

Hire at least one full time officer

In the small adjacent towns, I think that combining resources is fiscally sound and best for public safety,

It's fine the way it is.

I'm sorry I can't be very helpful - I just don't have enough information. If I look up crime statistics for New Salem, I find that no crime has been committed in years 2014 and beyond. There seem to have been crimes reported for years 2013 and previously (https://masscrime.chs.state.ma.us/tops/report/crime-overview/new-salem/2013). This site contains the disclaimer: "The data in this theme is NIBRS and only reflects data from agencies who have successfully submitted NIBRS data for the selected year." I suspect that no one has been entering data for years after 2013. Without any data, I really can't make any judgment about our police department. With no crime reported, we may do just as well with a scarecrow dressed up as a police officer as with a fully staffed 24 hour police force.

Provide paid benefits for the chief and anyone else who works 20hrs per week.





There are not enough police officers or hours that the community is patrolled. 202 is too busy and there are too many accidents/speeders not to have someone on duty

We need more officers to patrol for more hours. The community is not safe with police from other towns taking too long to respond

Police presence should be increased to full time standards

Not enough policing in the community, particularly the 202 corridor

We will have no say so on any future Police Chiefs that may be hired for the town we choose to contract out with and may wind up with a Police Chief that does not reflect the policing style

that is desired in New Salem. Once we dissolve our Police Department it will be very costly to bring one back on line and am concerned that the contracts as they go forward may be too costly for New Salem and dramatically impact our property tax rate.

My major concern is to keep the New Salem police functioning as well as they do now but with better accommodations. It's awful to ask them to work in their cars or in that moldy basement space they have now. I have all good feeling and entirely support the New Salem police.

If we share police duties with another town, the response times for New Salem residents can be significantly delayed due to the coverage from those other towns. Then would coverage fall to the State Police?

Finance needs to be a better job allowing funds to be used and to give the town what it needs. Keep our police department and start funding for a new police station, fix the town hall or tear it down to create one all use building with proper offices. Figure out how to provide more than part time work and no benefits.

Would like to be able to contact local police without having to go through a dispatcher for non-emergency use.

I think more patrols would keep offends out of New Salem, and keep crime rates down, and better response times.

I don't think the taxpayers should be required to fund a private unmarked cruiser for the out of town chief. Car should remain in Town. Chief can use from Town for police duties. Shared dept such as wendell and leverett have should be looked into.

The survey was not easy to use

I need more info, but generally I feel safe.

I appreciate the efforts made by the study committee to request resident opinions and suggestions. I did attend the informational meeting regarding this survey. I do, however, share with other attendees, the feeling that many of us lack adequate data and a true picture of our police department's needs and changing scope of duties. What I do experience and feel, is the changing demands that any modern day police (or fire) department(s) are expected to be prepared to respond to. Just the traffic demands over the last 15 years has dramatically increased on 202!. Am I "happy" with the current department? Yes....if you are asking me about the half dozen encounters that I have had with officers over my 70 plus years in town....but I need to respond with a "no" when thinking that a regional department might be a better option if the need for more personnel, hours, equipment and a better station are what's needed. I think it's time to get the department out of the basement and shed some light on the situation! Suggestion: do have another town info meeting after you tabulate the response to your survey. It would allow for further feedback.
